MIDALJA TAL-BRONŻ GHAŻ-ŻGHAŻAGH MALTIN FIL-BOWLING

Dawn is-subien Maltin kisbu l-ewwel midalja fl-istorja tal-Malta Bowling Association fil-European Youth Championships.

Iż-żgħażaġh Maltin Nicolai Mallia, Dwayne Zahra, Kayden Laganà, u Nicholas Muscat kisbu riżultat storika għal bowling Malti u flimkien rebħu midalja tal-bronż fil-kategorija tat-timijiet.

Din kienet l-ewwel darba li żgħażaġh Maltin kisbu midalja f'din il-kompetizzjoni fl-istorja kollha tal-Malta Bowling Association.

It-tim ta' erbgħa kkwalfikaw għal-faži finali fit-tielet post fost il-21 skwadri nazzjonali kollha wara serje ta' sitt logħbiet kollettiv. Flimkien, is-subien kellhom logħba medja ta' 829 pins (medja ta' 207.2 għal kull plejer).

Fis-semifinali, il-Maltin sfortunatament ma setgħux jegħlbu lit-tim tal-Isvezja - ir-runners-up eventwali. Il-Maltin tilfu 857-781 kontrihom.

Dan ir-riżultat huwa prova li Malta għandha wieħed mill-aqwa programmi madwar l-Ewropa.

HISTORIC BRONZE MEDAL FOR MALTESE BOWLING

Maltese Youths earn first ever medal for Team Malta at the European Youth Championships.

Maltese youths Nicolai Mallia, Dwayne Zahra, Kayden Laganà, and Nicholas Muscat achieved history for Maltese bowling as they collectively earned themselves a bronze medal in the Boys' Team event.

This was the first time Maltese youths have ever achieved a podium finish in the Malta Bowling Association's history of taking part in the prestigious European Youth Championships.

The team of youths qualified for the final stages in 3rd place amongst all 21 boys' teams after an impressive 6-game block. Together, all boys averaged 829 pins per game (207.2 average per player).

After qualifying for the semi-finals, the Maltese were unfortunately beaten by the eventual runners-up Sweden, losing against the momentous Scandinavians 857-781.

This result has proved that Malta has one of the most successful youth programmes across all Europe as the future looks brighter than ever for these youths, and others cheering them on from home.
