



## Bowling – Rebbieħa ġodda fl-10 Edizzjoni tal-MBA Silver Cup

L-ġħaxar edizzjoni tal-MBA Silver Cup ġara dal-weekend u rajna lil żewġ rebbieħa ġodda - Peter Lyndley mill-kategorija tal-irġiel u Mia Bugeja mill-kategorija tan-nisa. Dan it-turnament kien miftuħ lejn il-membri kollha tal-Malta Bowling Association (MBA) b'medja ta' 170 u inqas għall-irġiel u 165 u inqas għan-nisa.

Mia Bugeja sabet ruħha fl-ewwel post mil-bidu sal-aħħar. Iż-żagħżugħha kkwalifikat għall-finali wara li lagħbet puntegg medju ta' 182.50 waqt il-faži tal-kwalifikazzjoni, imbagħad baqgħet fl-ewwel post waqt il-finali li ntagħbu f'round robin.

Waqt il-finali, il-finalisti kollha (l-aqwa tmien atleti miż-żewġ kategoriji) lagħbu kontra xulxin f'round robin, fejn kull plejer lagħab laqgħa diretta kontra kull finalist - b'kollo, kull finalist lagħab seba' logħbiet. Għal kull laqgħa diretta li ntrebhet, kompetituri kienu ppremjati b'20 punti bonus; dawn il-punti bonus ġew miżjud fuq il-pinfall totali li l-atleta ġab fuq is-serje ta' seba' logħbiet.

Bugeja reġgħet tejbet il-logħob tagħha waqt il-finali - hi lagħbet is-seba' logħbiet b'puntegg medju ta' 185.14 biex tkun ir-rebbieħa tas-Silver Cup għal din is-sena. Il-bowler minn Division 2 rebħet 6/7 laqgħat diretti u fil-process hi skurjat l-ogħla logħba mill-kategorija tan-nisa fil-finali (226). Minkejja li daħlet go din il-kompetizzjoni b'medja ta' 159.81, Bugeja rnexxieħha tegħleb il-kompetituri tagħha b'mod dominanti.

Mill-kategorija tal-irġiel, Peter Lyndley kien ir-rebbieħ xokkanti tal-MBA Silver Cup 2022. B'medja ta' 141.61, tħdejn il-participanti l-oħrajn, Lyndley ma kienx favorit mistenni li jirbaħha. Lyndley ikkwalifika għal faži finali fis-seba' post wara li lagħab serje ta' 1025 fuq sitt logħbiet (skor medju ta' 147.83 + 23 handicap kull logħba). Però, il-bowler veteran minn Division 2 tejjeb il-logħob tiegħu meta kien il-ħin mistenni biex jispiċċa fl-ewwel post. Lyndley rebaħ 6/7 laqgħat diretti u lagħab b'medja ta' 167.71 fis-seba' logħbiet (mingħajr ma ngħodd lu il-punti handicap) sabiex jitla' sitt postijiet u jikkonferma ir-rebħa surpriza tiegħu. Ir-rebbieħ irnexxielu jilħaq l-ewwel post fl-aħħar frejms tal-aħħar logħba; hu spiċċa b'24 punti biss fuq Tomas Caruso - iż-żagħżugħ li spiċċa fit-tieni post.

L-istudent minn NSS Tomas Caruso u l-bowler mill-iskwadra tas-Special Olympics Natasha Bianchi spicċaw fit-tieni post waqt li l-bowlers adoloxxenti Travis Barbara u Kathryn Fenech spicċaw fit-tielet post fil-kategoriji rispettivi tagħhom.



**New Champions Crowned at the MBA Silver Cup 2022**

The 10<sup>th</sup> edition of the MBA Silver Cup just took place and crowned two new champions – Peter Lyndley from the male category and youth bowler Mia Bugeja from the female category. Participants eligible to enter this annual tournament were males with a composite average not exceeding 170 and females with a composite average not exceeding 165.

Mia Bugeja led the women's category from start to finish. The teenager qualified for the finals in 1<sup>st</sup> place after averaging 182.50 in the qualifying round and then also led all girls and women in the round robin finals.

During the latter stage, all finalists (the top 8 after qualifying) faced off in a round robin stage, in which each player faced every other person in a one-on-one to play seven total games. Winning a one-on-one added bonus points to the competitors' total pinfall, derived from the games they played throughout.

Bugeja improved her play during the finals, averaging 185.14 over 7 games to be this year's Silver Cup champion. The Division 2 bowler won 6/7 one-on-ones and rolled the highest game of the finals for her category, scoring a high game of 226 during her triumphant run. She entered the tournament with a registered composite average game of 159.81.

From the men, Peter Lyndley was the unexpected Silver Cup winner of 2022 after a surprising run in the finals. Lyndley qualified as the 7<sup>th</sup> seed after averaging 147.83 to just make the cut, and seriously improved his game when it mattered the following day to win the tournament. With a composite average of just 141.61 per game, no one expected the veteran Division 2 bowler to win 6/7 one-on-ones in the finals or average 167.71 (not including his 23 handicap) across the 7-game block or to climb from 7<sup>th</sup> to 1<sup>st</sup> place to complete his underdog victory. Unlike Bugeja, Lyndley scraped his tournament win in a closely fought contest; the eventual winner only ended the series 24 pins ahead of the runner-up Tomas Caruso.

Runners-up were NSS student Tomas Caruso for the men and Special Olympics bowler Natasha Bianchi for the women. Youth bowlers Travis Barbara and Kathryn Fenech rounded out the podiums in 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
